2016 BURNSVILLE ARBOR DAY TREE SALE SET FOR SATURDAY, APRIL 30

Adding a tree to a property can reduce energy bills, help protect water quality and add beauty. The City of Burnsville will once again be selling hundreds of bare root trees at its annual tree sale.

What:	2016 Arbor Day Tree Sale
Who:	Burnsville Residents Only <i>(IDs will be checked)</i>
When:	Saturday, April 30 7-10 a.m. <i>(or until all trees are sold)</i>
Where:	75 Civic Center Parkway – Across from Burnsville City Hall

Bare root tree prices range from \$20-\$35. Quantities are limited to two trees per household. Trees are locally grown and vary in size from 5 to 12 feet. Only cash or checks will be accepted.

****Please note that Native Plants and Shrubs will NOT be sold at the Tree Sale. They will be available at the "Native Plant Market" to be held on May 21.**

Tree Sale Tips:

- Prepare planting sites before attending the sale
- Call Gopher State One-Call (651-454-0002) to have utilities marked before digging
- Arrive early for the best selection
- Try to determine what trees you want before the sale
- Plan to plant bare root trees immediately
- Protect trees against damage from deer and rodents until they are well established; consider placing protection around them for the first few years
- Get a permit from the City if you plan to plant a tree within the boulevard/right-of-way on your property (15 feet in from the curb)

APPLE *Honeycrisp*

Height: 15-20'
Width: 12-15'
Light: Full sun
Soil: Well drained
Fall Color: Yellow



Notes: Outstanding flavor. Needs to be planted near another apple or crabapple with same bloom time (mid-season). Ripens late September.

APPLE *State Fair*

Height: 15-20'
Width: 15-20'
Light: Full sun
Soil: Well drained
Fall Color: Yellow



Notes: Medium-sized red striped fruit. Needs to be planted near another apple or crabapple with same bloom time (early-season). Ripens mid-late August.

CRABAPPLE *Spring Snow*

Height: 25-30'
Width: 15-20'
Light: Full Sun
Soil: Well drained
Fall Color: Yellow



Notes: Fruitless crabapple with white flowers in spring. Round to oval growth

CRABAPPLE *Pink Spires*

Height: 15-20'
Width: 12'
Light: Full Sun
Soil: Well-drained
Fall Color: Yellow



Notes: Pink flowers in spring. Bright red fruit in fall. Leaves turn copper color in fall. Narrow upright shape.

BIRCH *Whitespire*

Height: 30-40'
Width: 20-25'
Light: Full sun
Soil: Dry-moist
Fall Color: Yellow



Notes: Non-peeling, chalky white bark. Resistant to birch borer, especially if heat stress is reduced. Tolerates high pH.

SERVICEBERRY *Autumn Brilliance*

Height: 15-20'
Width: 15'
Light: Full-part sun
Soil: Well drained
Fall Color: Red



Notes: *Native*. Showy white flowers in May. Produces edible berries. Tolerates tough conditions. Stunning red-orange fall color.

ELM *New Horizon*

Height: 30-40'
Width: 25'
Light: Full sun
Soil: Medium to well-drained
Fall Color: Gold



Notes: Compact, upright, fast-growing elm hybrid (Siberian elm x Japanese elm). Adapts to wet and dry soil conditions. Tolerates light shade.

HACKBERRY

Height: 50-75'
Width: 50'
Light: Full-part sun
Soil: Dry to Moist



Fall Color: Yellow

Notes: *Native*. Tolerant of harsh urban conditions. Can tolerate clay soil. Interesting corky bark. Small berries feed songbirds.

HONEYLOCUST *Skyline*

Height: 50'
Width: 30-35'
Light: Full-part sun
Soil: Dry-moist
Fall Color: Golden-yellow



Notes: Fast growing tree. Small leaflets produce filtered shade. Tough tree, grows in poor conditions: drought, standing water, cold, salt and poor soils.

LILAC *Ivory Silk*

Height: 20-25'
Width: 10-15'
Light: Full to part sun
Soil: Well-drained
Fall Color: Yellow



Notes: Large creamy, white, fragrant blossoms in mid-June. Great under utility lines or in small areas.

LINDEN *American Sentry*

Height: 40-50'
Width: 25-30'
Light: Full sun
Soil: Average to well-drained
Fall Color: Yellow



Notes: Hardy shade tree. Well-branched and uniform growth. Fragrant yellow flowers provide nectar for honeybees.

RED MAPLE *Northwoods*

Height: 50'
Width: 35'
Light: Full to part sun
Soil: Prefers moist
Fall Color: Red-orange



Notes: Symmetrically round to oval crown. Can grow in a wide variety of soils. Cold hardy.

NORTHERN RED OAK

Height: 60-80'
Width: 40-50'
Light: Full sun
Soil: Sandy, well drained
Fall Color: Vibrant red



Notes: *Native*. Fastest growing oak. Pyramidal when young, rounded when older. Prune in winter to avoid oak wilt.

SWAMP WHITE OAK

Height: 50-60'
Width: 40-50'
Light: Full sun
Soil: Moist-wet
Fall Color: yellow-brown



Notes: *Native*. Prefers moist to wet soil. Can tolerate dry as well as clay soils. Fast growing oak. Acorns important to wildlife.

SUGAR MAPLE *Green Mountain*

Height: 60'
Width: 50'
Light: Full to part sun
Soil: Well drained to moist
Fall Color: Yellow, red, orange



Notes: Tolerates shade. Does not tolerate clay soil.

Linden <i>American Sentry</i>	○	40 - 50 ft.	25 - 30 ft.	Dry to moist Adapts to pH	Yellow	Hardy shade tree with symmetrical growth. Fragrant yellow flowers provide nectar food source for honeybees. Tolerant of urban conditions.	\$35
Locust <i>Skyline</i>	○	50 ft.	30 - 35 ft.	Dry to moist	Golden-yellow	Pyramidal shaped crown. Thornless and seedless. Produces filtered shade. Salt and drought tolerant.	\$35
Red Maple <i>Northwoods</i>	○	50 ft.	35 ft.	Prefers moist, slightly acidic soil	Red-orange	Red maple variety. Symmetrical round to oval crown. Introduced by the University of Minnesota. Sensitive to soil salt, salt spray, and drought.	\$35
Sugar Maple <i>Green Mountain</i>	○●	60 ft.	50 ft.	Well drained, moist	Yellow, red and orange	Sugar maple. Tolerates shade, often seen as an understory tree on the forest floor. Does not tolerate clay soil. Creates dense shade.	\$35
Northern Red Oak	○●●	60 - 80 ft.	40 - 50 ft.	Prefers sandy, well drained	Vibrant red	Native. Fast growing. Pyramidal form when young, rounded when older. <i>Prune in winter to avoid Oak Wilt.</i> Retains leaves through winter.	\$35
Swamp White Oak	○●	50 - 60 ft.	40 - 50 ft.	Prefers moist to wet. Will tolerate dry	Yellowish brown	Native. Can tolerate wet and dry areas as well as clay soils. Acorns for wildlife. Fast growing oak. Holds leaves through winter. <i>Prune in winter to avoid Oak Wilt.</i>	\$35

Serviceberry <i>Autumn Brilliance</i>	○●	15 - 25 ft.	15 ft.	Moist to well-drained	Red	Native. Large clusters of showy white flowers in May. Produces edible berries which can be used for jam and jelly. Tolerates tough conditions. Brilliant fall color.	\$35
Apple <i>Honey Crisp</i>	○	12 - 15 ft.	12 - 15 ft.	Well drained	Yellow	Large, dappled red fruit with a well-balanced flavor, outstanding crispness and juiciness. Fruit will easily store refrigerated for 6 or more months. Mid-season bloomer. Ripens late September.	\$25

Apple <i>State Fair</i>	○	15 - 20 ft.	15 - 20 ft.	Well drained	Yellow	Striped red, juicy, moderately tart fruit good for eating and cooking. The fruit will store for 2 to 4 to weeks. Tree is susceptible to fire blight and somewhat prone to biennial bearing. Early-season bloomer. Ripens mid-late August.	\$25
