Last Chance to Become a Master Recycler/Composter *Deadline to register is Oct. 1*

Individuals who live or work in Dakota County are invited to participate in the last Master Recycler/Composter class this year.

Classes will be held Thursdays, Oct. 5 through Nov. 9 from 6–8:30 p.m. at Burnhaven Library, 1101 County Road 42 West, Burnsville. A \$30 fee covers course materials and optional field trip transportation. Scholarships are available.

Learn how to inspire others to reduce waste with others that want to make our community better. Understand the ins and outs of recycling, hazardous waste, composting and more from regional experts. Join outings to landfill, organics and recycling facilities. Once classes are complete, participants will be asked to volunteer 30 hours of their time, putting their skills to work with other volunteers and county staff.
