





## Parks Rules and Ordinances

A number of park rules and ordinances have been established to assure that your visit to a Burnsville park is a positive experience. Your cooperation in abiding by the rules will be greatly appreciated by your fellow park users.

**Park Hours: 5:00 a.m. to 10 p.m.**

*It's illegal to:*

1. Possess, display or use intoxicating liquors in the following parks: Black Dog Park, Crystal Lake West Park (except boat launch), Crystal Lake Beach and beach viewing areas.
2. Possess, display or use intoxicating liquors in the following areas within all parks: Within 30 feet of youth fields and activities, parking lots and access roads, inside or on adult fields for all adult leagues, all recreation buildings and warming houses (except by special permit).
3. Allow dogs without a leash (except in Alimagnet Dog Park and inside hockey rinks).
4. Park or operate a motor vehicle including mopeds or motorcycles except on roads or designated parking areas.
5. Use or possess glass containers or bottles of any type.
6. Golf or play any games except in areas provided.
7. Injure any plant, flower, shrub, tree, grounds or other property.
8. Remain in any park area after closing.
9. Litter or dump - including pet waste.

## Alimagnet Dog Park

Alimagnet Park, 1200 Alimagnet Park Drive • Open year-round: 5 a.m. – 10 p.m.

Located within seven acres of Alimagnet Park, the City's dog park is completely fenced with a double-gated entrance, lights and heated shelter. It also includes a water area, open grass area, wooded area and one-half mile rock trail. For the safety of all dog park patrons, specific rules are posted at the park and online, which must be followed at all times.

A voluntary annual membership is available for each family using the park. The fee of \$20 per family helps support maintenance and administration. Membership is not required to use the park. Memberships can be purchased online at [www.burnsville.org/recreation](http://www.burnsville.org/recreation) or at Burnsville City Hall, 100 Civic Center Parkway.

As a reminder, Burnsville City Code states that dogs must be on a leash (Alimagnet Dog Park excluded) and under the command of their owner or custodian at all times.

## Burnsville Lions Playground

The new Burnsville Lions Playground at Cliff Fen Park has 87 play pieces and is able to accommodate up to 265 children at one time. Play pieces are geared toward children of all ages. 
